Presenter/Speaker/Author Guidelines for Selecting the Best Available Evidence

STEPS

- 1. Identify the evidence
 - The evidence may include research of different types, expert opinion, personal experience from experts in the field
- Select the best evidence
 - Based on hierarchy or level of available evidence
 - System reviews-metanalysis, RCTs cohort studies, case-control, cross sectional analyses, case studies & case reports, expert opinion (ideas, opinions, editorials anecdotal)
- 3. Conduct a Critical Appraisal of the evidence
 - Examine for quality and the level of evidence
- 4. Evaluate the findings
 - Draw conclusions related to the value for the learning activity
 - Is the evidence strong enough to influence clinical practice
- 5. Summarize the evidence from your evaluation
- 6. Integrate the evidence from the literature search with other types of evidence into your presentation
